- Founded by the Society of Jesus (the "Jesuits"), with a rich history of serving Montreal's English Catholic community, Loyola High School's mission is to form mature, responsible "men for and with others". Students of all faith traditions are welcome to apply for admission, with the understanding that those enrolled will learn about the Catholic religious tradition and will be encouraged to deepen and be committed to their own spiritual growth. Through study, prayer, retreats and action, Loyola fosters a knowledge and love of God, self, humanity, and the world, as well as a commitment to the service of one's neighbour. Seeking to become a member of the Loyola community implies a commitment to explore, uphold and promote the values that are an essential part of Loyola's identity.
