Course Outline

The students will continue to explore their emerging adult faith and develop a better understanding of the impact that a faith-based foundation can have in one's life.

The students will discover a basic Catholic theology of faith and the Holy Trinity. They will encounter the theoretical aspects of the Catechism of the Catholic Church by addressing the role of the Church in their faith journeys. The class will develop an understanding of the value of the Seven Sacraments and explore how their experience connects to their theoretical foundations of faith.

Students will read a novel entitled *Tattoos on the Heart* which explores the faith experience and characteristics of Grad at Graduation. **They will be challenged to identify what it means to witness Christ in their lives. Contemporary challenges will be openly discussed within the context of the Church's teachings; including family life, internet, gaming, drugs, and sexuality.**

'Spirit in Action' Project

During the second term, students will produce a project that will highlight their spiritual growth and faith journeys. Using their talents, they will develop their own ideas and strategies to share Jesus' message of love, forgiveness, and togetherness with the greater community.

Homework policy

- Students must complete homework assignments accurately, neatly, and on time. Homework and/or assignments handed in late will be penalized 10% per day to a maximum of 3 days late. After 3 days, a mark of zero (0) will be assigned.

If absent for a test

Christian Service Program (CSP I-IV)

A distinguishing characteristic of Jesuit education is to help students realize that talents are to be developed, not for self-satisfaction, but for the whole of the community.

Students are encouraged to use their gifts in the service of others. In keeping with these goals, students in Secondary 2 must successfully complete a “service” portion each term.

This includes:

- A minimum of 4 hours of service work each term (before and after Christmas).
- Setting up an appropriate project is entirely the student’s responsibility. There are projects that can be selected from the list offered through Mr. Sean Donovan (CSP coordinator), on the Moodle site. Or, students may elect to find their own projects which require the approval of the CSP coordinator before being undertaken.
- NO PROJECT should be undertaken without prior approval from Mr. Donovan.
- The 200-300-word reflection paper must be uploaded to the Religion teacher’s Moodle Page no later than 5 calendar days after the final service work has been completed.
- All detailed information, documentation and deadlines can be found on the CSP (I-IV) link of the Loyola Moodle website. Students are responsible for the information on this site.

ALL students must register on Moodle using the enrolment key:

INIGO(your year#)(your class letter). Ex.: INIGO2B

MAKE SURE you register using **YOUR CLASS**. Students enrolling with another class’ enrolment key will be **KICKED OUT**.

It is important to note that students who do not complete their CSP requirements will receive a **FAILING GRADE** and it will be considered a failed course. Students should take this responsibility seriously and plan accordingly. (See the Failure Policy section on the Moodle site).
