Absences

- If a student is ABSENT for a class, THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE for acquiring class notes and assignments.

- Quizzes/Tests: A student who knows that he will be absent for a test, MUST INFORM HIS TEACHER 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE in order to schedule a date and time to write the missed test. A student who is absent because of an illness or for unexpected reasons, must make arrangements to write the missed test ON THE FIRST DAY BACK in school following his absence, regardless if he has his class scheduled on that day.
- A student who fails to meet his responsibility for the scheduling of a missed test, may receive a grade of ZERO.
